Transporting cargo on an active worksite, material handling in a busy warehouse, driving a truck and trailer in a yard, and maintenance staff working on equipment can all be hazardous to people walking in the same area as heavy equipment such as trucks, trailers, and lift trucks. Back up beepers, lights, and horns are all good safety precautions for pedestrian traffic to be made aware of such hazards, but high visibility of pedestrians to the workers driving these types of equipment is very important. When all company employees are wearing high visibility vests or clothing, this promotes a safe, unified front for safety. Please wear your safety vests if you are sharing space with heavy equipment and traffic. If you do not have a vest available to you, please inquire with management.
