## THEFT PREVENTION

Due to recent events in which one of our drivers had their wallet stolen out of their truck at a stop in only 41 seconds (this includes the approach, theft, and getaway) I thought it would be a good idea to put theft prevention tips as our topic this month.

While making pickups and deliveries, we sometimes leave ourselves open to the risk of theft, not only the vehicle but the contents of the vehicle's cab. Your wallet, cash, keys etc.

- Never leave your wallet, purse, cash or other items in your vehicle
- If you must leave items in your vehicle, do not let them be visible to people passing by.
- Always lock your doors when you leave the vehicle.
- Make sure your windows are rolled up.
